II. Chapter Activities and Events

Fall 2023 marked the inaugural semester of The Aquaculture Collective (AquaCo), the Virginia Institute of Marine Science Student Subunit of the United States Aquaculture Society (USAS).

- Recruitment efforts began in Spring 2023. 4 undergraduate class announcements were made. Flyers were distributed around the VIMS and W&M campuses in public places. Emails were also sent out to various departments. 62 people signed up through the QR code.
- 2 interest meetings were held. In total, we had 15 people show up to these meetings.
- 5 members attended the Virginia Aquaculture Conference. This a two-day meeting in Newport News, Virginia, oriented for shellfish farmers in the mid-Atlantic region. 2 students gave presentations.

- 1 chapter meeting was held in November 2023. 14 members attended.
- 1 graphic element was created for AquaCo with the help of the VIMS Publication Center Manager (see below)
- 10,000 juvenile oysters were obtained from VIMS Aquaculture and Breeding Center. They are held on the VIMS research farm and will be used to conduct research on shellfish gear and blue crab interactions. The study will be deployed in January 2024.
- An election for the undergraduate representative was held. Three undergrads submitted applications, and a chapter-wide vote was held.
- 4 applicants applied for a chance to attend Aquaculture America in 2024.
